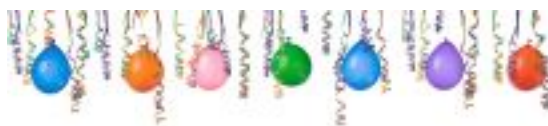

BIG OOPS! I misspoke in my Chaplain's Corner in last month's *VIBES*. BV is NOT the only CCRC in Sarasota Co. with a full-time chaplain. My apologies! Still, let us rejoice that we are a **full service** CCRC.

Now, let me suggest another *possible* OOPS. There is an area here at BV which just might be improperly named ... oops. We all know this area simply as the Reception Desk or Front Desk. Based on what I observe from my office only 15 feet away, maybe we need a new name. On a regular basis at least all of the following happens at the same time: **guests** are not just "greeted" ... they are "welcomed;" **residents** are notified of packages or prescriptions ready to be picked up; **caring** is given to residents leaving or returning from hospitals; **potential new residents** are met enthusiastically by our Marketing Team; **immediate contact** is made with Security Staff in response to residents' requests; **immediate notice** is made with Housekeeping Staff to act on a variety of residents' needs; **residents** welcome family and friends visiting for dinner or for the weekend; **staff** is aided with up-to-date information they need; **a kaleidoscope of phone calls** are received/answered/referred in a spirit of caring, efficiency and patience.
