A Salute to American Workers

Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is a creation of the labor movement and dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to strength, prosperity and well-being of our country.

More than 100 years after the first Labor Day observance, there is still some doubt as to who first proposed the holiday for workers, but what is clear is that The Central Labor Union adopted a Labor Day proposal and appointed a committee to plan a demonstration and picnic. This was on Tuesday, Sept. 5, 1882, in New York City. In 1884, the Central Labor Union selected the first Monday in September as the holiday. By 1885, many industrial cities followed suit and celebrated along with New York.

Now, a national holiday, and to many families the "unofficial-official" end of summer, the nation pays tribute on Labor Day to the creator of so much of the nation's strength, freedom and leadership—the American worker—with picnics and other celebrations. At Bay Village, we have our own picnic to celebrate and it is held in the dining room at noon, 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. Please dial ext. 2113 to make reservations!

B.I.L.L. NEWS

Our current DVD series is from The Teaching Company and National Geographic titled "Polar Explorations." Delve into the fascinating history, science, culture and wildlife of Antarctica and the Arctic.

During this series, we will have four evenings that we take a "break" from the DVD and speaker Baila Miller will present "Paris The Luminous Years (or La Belle Epoque (1870-1914))." Our first class in that series was Aug. 4 and it was very well received!

Who would have dreamed that the once traditional city of Paris would become the center of freedom in Europe? This course examines the exhilarating, scandalous and intimate relationships of young artists and authors who shaped this magical era that came to be known as "La Belle Epoque" (1870-1914).

Artists such as The French Impressionists, Pablo Picasso and

Juan Gris, writers such as Gertrude Stein and Ernest Hemingway, booksellers Sylvia Beach, Adrienne Monnier, and many others made up this legendary milieu.

Class Two will be held on Sept. 1 and is titled: Art Nouveau and the French Impressionists. Post-Impressionism, also known as Art Nouveau (1890-1914), was an arts and crafts movement that was heavily influenced by the Oriental World. The simple and sublime Far Eastern way of seeing the world created new opportunities and modalities of expression for classically trained Western Artists. The effect of Orientalization in traditional art produced a new look that was influenced with a love of nature and transcendent emotion.

Our next class from Adult and Community Education is another "How Novel" series with popular instructor Alice Blueglass. Class will be held on Tuesdays in the board room on Sept. 29 and Oct. 13 and 27.

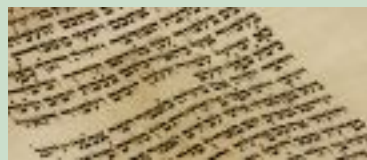



Chaplain's Corner

"The Shot Heard 'Round The World," such as:

- the shot which started the Revolutionary War in 1775;
- the 1914 assassination of Archduke Ferdinand of Austria which served as a major catalyst of WWI;
- the game-winning home run by NY Giants Bobby Thomson to win the NL pennant in 1951.

As I write this in early August, I am surrounded by the media coverage of the "shot heard 'round the world" in the killing of the African lion, Cecil, in Zimbabwe by American dentist/hunter Walter Palmer. The alleged illegal tactics in pursuit of personal pleasure and greed certainly raise crucial questions as to the ethical treatment of any animal as part of God's creation. The outpouring of moral outrage has captured social media.

An even more crucial question for me: *"Where is my moral outrage against the 'shots heard 'round the world' in terms of human rights?!"*

- the killing of human beings in street violence - regardless of one's race;
- the killing of thousands of humans in mass genocide - regardless of the nation;
- the killing of a person's right to vote - regardless of the county or country;
- the killing of a person's right to health care, education, employment, justice - regardless of one's "status."

QUESTIONS TO MYSELF: Which "shots" cause me moral outrage? Which "shots" *should* cause me moral outrage as a person of faith? What do I need to do to become a change agent?

My answer is crucial to who I am as a creature of God.
