All About Easter

Easter, one of the most important holidays in Christianity, celebrates the central event of the Christian faith: the resurrection of Jesus Christ after his crucifixion. This event is significant to Christians because, through his death and resurrection, Jesus suffered for the sins of the world, yet was able to overcome death.

Easter is observed on the first Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after the vernal equinox (the first day of spring). According to the Bible, the events of the crucifixion and resurrection occurred during the Jewish Passover, a springtime celebration.

Easter is preceded by Lent, a 40-day period of fasting and repentance that begins on Ash Wednesday. The Sunday before Easter is Palm Sunday, the day that Jesus arrived in Jerusalem. The week before Easter is called Holy Week.

During Holy Week, Christians observe Maundy Thursday, when the Last Supper with Jesus and his disciples took place; and Good Friday, the day of the crucifixion. The resurrection is then celebrated on Easter Sunday.

Children often participate in Easter egg hunts and look forward to visits from the Easter Bunny, who is said to deliver candy and eggs during the night. Eggs and rabbits were once used as fertility symbols during ancient springtime festivals, but now represent new life when associated with the Easter holiday.

B.I.L.L. NEWS~A Few Months of Russian History & Music!

Our current DVD series from the Teaching Company is "The History of Russia," Peter the Great to Gorbachev, and it is held every Tuesday, at 7:30 p.m., in the auditorium.

Your B.I.L.L. committee has decided to break this long series into three parts. Part one begins with politics and culture on the eve of Peter the

Great's efforts to transform his country; then, it looks at Peter and his reforms. Next, women's rule is examined with particular focus on Catherine the Great. Then, the Purgachev Uprising will be covered, as well as writer Nikolai Novikov.

Next, we consider Decembrist rebellion, in which nobles took arms against the state to bring about social and political reform. Part I of this series has ended.

Your instructor for this course is Dr. Mark Steinberg, a professor of history at the University of Illinois at

Urbana-Champaign and director of the Russian and East European Center.

He is the winner of a number of prestigious awards, including Yale University's Sarai Ribicoff Prize for Teaching. We hope you will make plans to join us for what should be a fascinating class!

Following part 2 of this series, we'll show a 5-week class about the life of Russian composer Tchaikovsky.

Part 2 of the "Russian History" series recently began on February 16th so we hope you will join us for that! This is a 6-week series.

Chaplain's Corner
Rev. Dr. Chuck Moffett

Martin Niemoller (1892-1984) was a prominent German theologian and pastor who was outspoken in his opposition to Hitler and the Nazi regime. He spent the last seven years of the Nazi rule in concentration camps. Niemoller is well remembered for the following quotation about the torture inflicted by the Nazis:

"First they came for the Socialists, and I did not speak out - because I was not a Socialist.

Then they came for the Trade Unionists, and I did not speak out - because I was not a Trade Unionist.

Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out - because I was not a Jew.

Then they came for me - and there was no one left to speak for me."

How easy it is to minimize, or even ignore, the plight, pain, or persecution of others as long as it does not rain on "my parade." How often we condone outrageous actions toward others as long as the actions are "not in my backyard." How quickly we are willing to abandon, reject, or even outlaw others from our community or country simply because they are different from us. This "we/they" attitude is a major factor contributing to the disease and distrust and destruction dividing our world by violence and war.

This way of believing and living is absolutely contrary to the God who created each one of us, and calls us to regard everyone as a child of God. Just imagine what it would do if any of our residents or employees were to treat someone else with anything less than respect and compassion simply because the other person did not live on our floor, or was a "community" resident instead of a "permanent" resident.

Too much of our political and social rhetoric these days encourages us to treat others with disdain, simply because, in the words of Niemoller, *"I am not one of them."*
