John Adams, the Pulitzer Prize winning book from author David McCullough, is now the critically acclaimed seven-part miniseries from HBO Films~ a sprawling, epic production from executive producers Tom Hanks and Gary Goetzman, two of the Emmy Award-winning

series, Band of Brothers.

Starring Academy Award nominees Paul Giamatti ("Cinderella Man") and Laura Linney ("The Savages") as John and Abigail Adams and directed by Emmy winner Tom Cooper ("Elizabeth I") and adapted by Kirk Ellis and Michelle Ashford from McCullough's book, John Adams is the incredible saga of a man who dreamed a nation and watched it come true.
