Kitt Moran Performs!

We are excited to report that jazz cabaret vocalist Kitt Moran and her band are scheduled to perform for us on Thursday, August 4th at 7:30 p.m. in the auditorium.

This is Kitt's first time performing here and we're thrilled to welcome her to the Bay Village stage. Although she embraces a variety of musical styles, Kitt Moran followed a fairly standard course getting her to where she is today. She is from New Jersey and got her start at age 10 performing professionally in children's roles in operas such as "Carmen" and "La Boheme" which she sang in French. She attended the American Musical and Dramatic Academy in New York, where she studied music and acting.

She settled in Atlantic City in 1994, where she was hired by Merv Griffin himself to become the first and only "chanteuse-in-residence" at his flagship casino gourmet restaurant. Even when the resort was purchased by Sun International, and began making sweeping changes throughout the property, they decided not to "fix what wasn't broken" and extended Kitt's contract.

Moran also sang in many of the most popular night clubs in Manhattan and has opened for Jay Leno, Rodney Dangerfield and Jackie Mason. 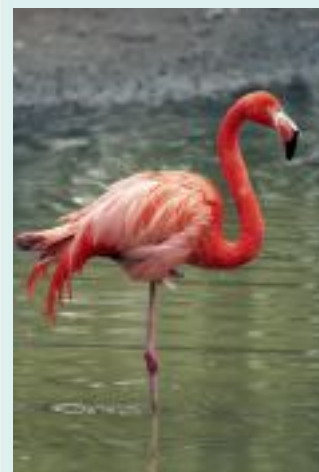
Trivial Pursuit!


Dollar Store Outings!

Olympic Dreams in Rio

From Aug. 5 through Aug. 21, more than 10,000 athletes will gather in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, to compete in the 2016 Summer Olympics, formally known as the Games of the XXXI Olympiad. These are the first Olympic Games to be held in South America.

Events will take place in four zones across Rio: Barra, Copacabana, Deodoro and Maracanã. Barra will be the site of the largest number of events, including golf, which has been added as an Olympic sport after being absent from the games for 112 years.

Another new event this year is rugby sevens, a 15-minute version of rugby with teams of seven. Rugby was last played at the Olympics in 1924, and the U.S. won the gold medal in the 15-player variant of the game.

At the last Summer Olympics, the U.S. won the most medals. In Rio, they will compete against 205 other countries in 306 medal events. With 42 different sports, ranging from archery to gymnastics to volleyball, this year's games are sure to provide plenty of opportunities for victory, as well as exciting entertainment for spectators and viewers around the world.

Chaplain's Corner Rev. Dr. Chuck Moffett

Western Kentucky is a magnificent area to visit, vacation, or live. Scenic state parks, lakes which lure the fisherman, the call of the wild for wilderness camping, southern speech and culture, institutions of higher learning, religious diversity...*what else could you desire?!*

When I moved there 48 years ago to serve a small congregation, one of my greatest desires was for street signs and highway markers. I would ask for directions on how to find a certain address to make a pastoral call, and usually the answer was given in terms of landmarks: *"Take the Boone farm road, turn left at the tobacco barn, bear right to Lassiter's store, then another right to the Concord Cemetery, and the house will be on your left - can't miss it."* Quickly, I learned you had to be a "native" to find your way around. As a newbie, I knew none of the landmarks.

Sometimes we all feel like newbies when faced with the daily and rapid change in our world. The old landmarks seem nowhere to be found. It is difficult, threatening, and sometimes impossible to find our direction in life. I get frustrated trying to keep up with the latest apps on my cell phone, much less with the latest world events which are changing the values, norms, attitudes, beliefs, and priorities of a world careening off its axis.

May each of us find the landmarks, street signs and markers which tell us how to travel in life. I pray that you will find the signs which point to grace, not punishment; understanding, not fear; respect, not revenge; justice, not judgment; inclusive, not exclusive; listen, not tell; care, not hate; love, not apathy. This is the way to life, not death, for all of us.
