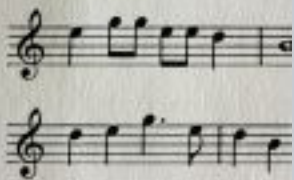
Earlye Musicke Consort Performs

Notable appearances include soloist with the National Symphony of the Ukraine, Puerto Rico Symphony Orchestra, National Symphony of Istanbul, Reno Chamber Orchestra, Guayaquil Symphony Orchestra, Bozeman Symphony, Orquesta Filarmónica de Boca del Río, Mexico, Texas Festival Orchestra, and San Angelo Symphony Orchestra.

Astonishing in her musical versatility, *violinist* Qing Li brings great warmth, poise and insight to her music making. Ms. Li is currently the BSO's Principal Second Violin, appointed by Yuri Temirkanov in 2000 upon winning the audition, and is frequently featured as a soloist. Other solo engagements have included the Butterfly Lovers Concerto at the Kimmel Center in Philadelphia, the Haydn violin concerto with the Richmond Symphony and the Bach Double Concerto with Hilary Hahn to name a few. Ms. Li is a Piatigorsky Foundation Artist, a much sought after recitalist, chamber musician and guest concertmaster, such as a guest concertmaster at the Iceland Symphony in Reykjavik. Throughout the great cities of America, South America, Europe and Asia, her broadcast appearances include a biography on Voice Of America, interviews on Baltimore's WBJC and WYPR radio, and television stations in the US, Germany and China.

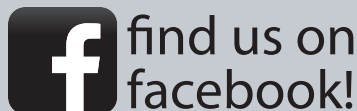

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

This article was begun on the eve of 2 major events:

--Feb. 14=Hallmark's money-maker of Valentine's Day

(1 billion cards, 35 million boxes of chocolate, 220 million roses = \$20 billion in revenue)

--Feb. 14=Christian celebration of Ash Wednesday

(a time centered on ashes, repentance, gratitude for God's *amazing grace*)

Both celebrations focus on LOVE. Hallmark emphasizes romantic love - which is good. Ash Wednesday emphasizes the awesome love of God for each one of us *in spite of who we are*.

Now, this article is being revised the day we go to print. Oh, the need we have in this country to see that each one of us sees the other person as a child of God, *in spite of who we are*. Surely this need is seen deeply in light of yesterday's shooting in Parkland, FL, where 17 people were gunned down in cold blood. Once again the cry goes out "This must stop!" Yet next week this will be "old" news, written off as an "unfortunate" event. Tell that to the families of those who never will be able to express their love to their dear one. "Unfortunate?" "Senseless?" How about "Sinful?" Sinful that each one of us allows revenge, hatred, priority of self, violence to be our way of life, instead of love, whether proclaimed by Valentine's Day or Ash Wednesday.

We do not live on our own merit. We live only in God's grace. The hope for our world is to remember that each of us - true for all of us - is a child of the One True God.
