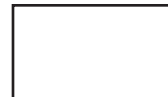

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A motto of mine for a loooong time has been: *"When you are up to your "waist" in alligators, it is hard to remember that your original intent was to drain the swamp."* When you face difficulties from all sides, it is so easy to throw up your hands in resignation: **"I QUIT!"**

Joe Albright, of Dial Hope, quoted a piece by Elizabeth Elliot which helps me. Elizabeth and her husband, Jim, were missionaries with the Auca Indians in Ecuador. When Jim was murdered, Elizabeth realized she had a choice: **"resignation"** or **"acceptance."** Her perspective helps me:

Only in acceptance lies peace.

--"resignation" = surrender to fate

--"acceptance" = surrender to God;

--"resignation" = lie down quietly in an empty universe

--"acceptance" = rise to meet the God of purpose;

--"resignation" = "it's all over for me"

--"acceptance" = "now that I'm here, what's next for me, Lord?"

--"resignation" = "what a waste"

--"acceptance" = "in what redemptive way can you use this mess, Lord?"

"Acceptance" is not a passive tolerance of a bad situation-- rather it calls for courage, risk, dedication, creativity, and dedication to trust our lives to God who will direct us as agents of redemption and wholeness.
