*We've got tickets for a free tour of the Elling Eide Center for Feb. 19th for a 90 minute FREE tour.* If you aren't familiar, *The Elling Eide Center* is a private research library and nature preserve overlooking Little Sarasota Bay. Dedicated to the study of classical Chinese literature and art, the Center fills a unique role in the cultural and scholarly landscape of its beautiful location.

Bequeathed by Sarasota resident Elling Eide, the 72-acre waterfront preserve brings together Old Florida and new modern architecture. *Sarasota architect Guy Peterson, FAIA,* designed the Center's research library, which shares the landscape with a rich assortment of native and exotic plants.

The Center's collection, amassed by Eide over six decades, contains comprehensive library holdings and special collections of rare books, manuscripts and artwork that represent a significant new resource for Asian Studies scholars. Following our tour, we will have lunch at Mattisons!



### **CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

*Rev. Dr. Chuck Moffett*

One month into the New Year, and already resolutions are being "excused." The Cafe Baci on Hwy 41 north in Sarasota is known for its humorous signs on the outside billboard. Currently: *"A New Year's resolution is something which goes in one year and out the other.*

In a classic *Calvin and Hobbes* cartoon, Hobbes asks Calvin, *"Did you make any resolutions for the new year?"* Calvin's response is indicative of too many of us today:

*"Heck no! I'm fine just the way I am! Why should I change? In fact, I think it's high time the world started changing to suit me! I don't see why I should do all the changing around here! If the New Year requires resolutions, I say it's up to everyone else. Not me! I don't need to improve. Everyone ELSE does."*

Could it be that it is this prevalent attitude on the part of so many in our world, in our country, and even in our community that is creating and nurturing a culture which is preventing us from having open and respectful dialogue which could lead to some sane and healthy solutions to the issues we face?
